PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

Carla Abodalo (Sociology) was interviewed and featured in the Reading Eagle article "Flash-mob violence a challenge for many police departments."

Soma Ghosh (Economics) served as a discussant at the Pennsylvania Economic Association Conference, June 2-4, 2011 at Dickinson College, Carlisle, PA. Her paper entitled "Participation in the Green Power Partnership: An Analysis of Higher Education Institutions as Partners in the Program" was accepted for publication in the *International Journal of Sustainability in Higher Education* and her paper entitled "Participation in School Choice: A Spatial Probit Analysis of Neighborhood Influence" was accepted for publication in *The Annals of Regional Science*. The "Online First" version was published on 8/14/2011.

Karen Jogan (Spanish) was invited to Chile to present a series of seminars in Spanish on institutional assessment and design and implementation of assessment plans for universities. The seminars, which took place in July in Santiago and Temuco Chile, were attended by administrators from various Chilean universities as well as by officials of the Chilean Ministry of Education. In August, Karen was the closing plenary speaker at the XIX Peru TESOL Convention (Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages) held in Lima. Her topic was "Differentiated instruction: engaging students in content."

Irene Langran's (Political Science) article, "Decentralization, Democratization, and Health: The Philippine Experiment," appeared in the *Journal of Asian and African Studies* in August.

Lindsay Phillips (Psychology) presented "Substance Use Disorders More Stigmatized Compared to Other Behavioral Health Disorders" at the 119th annual meeting of the American Psychological Association, Washington, DC. The second author was DCP Psychology graduate and current graduate student in Health Psychology, Aurtherine Shaw. She also presented "Qualitative Response to Use of Vignettes in Teaching Undergraduate Ethics" at the Canadian Psychological Association's 72nd Annual Convention, Toronto, Ontario. Dr. Phillips also was awarded Grant-In-Aid from the Society for the Psychological Study of Social Issues to continue research on how individuals cope with re-entry from prison to society.

Robert Seesengood (Religious Studies) had two works appear in print: "Wrestling with the 'Macedonian Call': Paul, Pauline Scholarship and Nineteenth-Century Colonial Missions." Faculty Exchange and Dialogue: Over the past three years, we have had several Faculty Dialogue in collaboration with the Higher Education Consortium of Berks County, which consists of the five county colleges. and the Berks Business-Education Coalition (BBEC). During these events, high school and higher education faculty exchanged ideas and resources. Feedback from participants has indicated a strong interest for reciprocal visits between high school and higher education faculty. Accordingly, the BBEC is coordinating a “**Faculty Exchange**” program and are looking for science, mathematics, and English faculty to participate. You will be paired with a high school faculty member in the same content area. The high school faculty member will visit Albright for a morning or afternoon (ideally observing two classes, not necessarily both of them taught by you) and you would visit the high school for a morning or afternoon to observe classes. The goal of these visits is to build understanding and relationships in order to facilitate discussion and idea exchange with regard to college transition, career/college readiness, and content area requirements. These discussions will then be incorporated into the Faculty Dialogue scheduled for November 2, 2011. Undergraduate Studies: (Joseph Thomas, Dean)

- The Summer Start program went off successfully once again under Director Rodney Warfield. Of 27 students who completed the program, 20 will matriculate. Profs. Ronning and Hager taught summer courses in the program, and Prof. Greenwood took over the study skills classes this year, increasing faculty involvement. Assessments are being undertaken through both students and staff to inform planning for next year.

- “Sneak Peek” pre-orientation hosted 79% of the incoming class (397 students) for advisement and other enrollment preparation, with positive reviews from both students and faculty. The 575 students attending August Orientation attended a number of academic success-related presentations given by the faculty and dean (special thanks to Profs. Hamann, Seesengood, Pankratz, and Matthews and Dean Crance).
- English placement was piloted for the Fall thanks largely to the efforts of Prof. Cacicedo, Registrar Dave Ballaban, and Library Director Rosemary Deegan. In all 53 students were placed in special sections of ENG 101 affording extra support.
- The dean’s office and the Experiential Learning and Career Development Center collaborated to bolster resources for Alpha students by creating Alpha 101, an 8-week, non-credit mini-course that will help Alpha students explore their interests, aptitudes, and choices in academic concentration and career.

Academic Learning Center (Erin Evans, Asst. Dean and Director)

- Staffing. Erin Evans will be on leave until late October. The office is being ably managed by Rebecca Makowiecki, the FT Secretary who joined us in June, with help of graduate assistant Amanda Rotay (in charge of tutoring) and undergraduate assistants Hilary Chubb and Emily McMordie. Dr. Mike Magdalinski of Reading Hospital will be in the office twice weekly to assist with disability services. Joe Thomas and several faculty will be advising students during Erin’s absence. Special thanks to Profs. Albright, Greenwood, Joella, Mason, and Palmer for their assistance. *Other volunteers accepted!* We request your understanding as we keep the ship afloat during this time. Please let Rebecca (x7662) or Joe (7556) know any needs or concerns that arise.
- Tutoring. Recruitment: We continue to recruit, with need especially in Spanish and sciences. Training: 10 tutor training sessions are planned for the fall 2011, involving faculty and seasoned tutors.
- Academic Skills Workshops. 10 workshops are scheduled and include faculty, staff, and tutor presenters. Our focus is on student motivation and responsibility for the learning process and oneself. See the ALC website for topics, dates, and locations.
- Disability service requests have risen (>40 incoming freshmen), and we anticipate more.
- Academic Probation program. The initial, mandatory meeting for student on probation will be 9/8. Dean Thomas and Profs. Greenwood and Gaffney will conduct the meeting. In Erin’s absence, Professor Greenwood be the designated academic coach for probation students.

- Albright recently received notification of four grant awards: \$4,000 from Enterprise Holdings Foundation to Karen Evans and the Career Center for enhanced career development activities for seniors; \$1,450 from the Society for Psychological Study of Social Issues (SPSSI) to Dr. Lindsay Phillips for research; \$7,500 from the Russell L. Hiller Charitable Fund of BCCF to CELG/John Kramer for development of a Citizen's Academy; and a Fulbright Lecturing Award (CIES) to Dr. Teresa Gilliams covering all expenses for her lecturing and research project during her sabbatical in Greece. In addition, the College received \$386,000 from the Margaret A. Cargill Foundation as the cash equivalent for stock awarded in 2009 for Art Education program expenses (along with a \$50,000 grant).
