E 2 Campus

The E 2 Campus text messaging system quickly provides you with important information should we have an emergency on campus. Travel

- I-94
- visa
- passport

Replacement of forms

If you lose any of the above forms, follow these directions to obtain a new form.

I-20: replacement may be obtained from the Multi-Ethnic Student Affairs Office

I-94: a form I-102 must be completed and submitted along with a money order or check in the amount of \$320.00. The I-102 may be obtained online at www.uscis.gov. Click on immigration forms.

Visa or passport: you must contact your country's embassy in the U.S. to replace your visa or passport. The phone number for your country's embassy can be found online at www.embassy.org.
